Employing an ABCD: Asset Based Community Development model- a strength-based approach to building community, CTC ensures that under-served children and youth are not viewed as 'at risk', victims or clients, but viewed as equal partners in the theater & community-building process. We take inventory of the 'assets' of the community we serve and empower ALL.

Several CTC After-School residencies serve under-served communities comprising of 91% African American; 9% Hispanic and 96% low-income families – who qualify for "NY State Free Lunch Program"

IN-SCHOOL PROGRAM 1-2

- Two CTC Teaching Artists (as well as visiting guest-artists) will co-direct a globalethic musical, in a collaborative partnership with an in-school faculty member which will take place during in-school hours
- CTC Creative Team and Teaching Artist can work independently or collaboratively with an **in-school faculty member** in implementing the following:
 - ✓ Three (3) fully-staged 45-minute / One Act Musicals (per age group) based on a United Nations themes (ie human rights, environment, race amity, literacy, advancement of women, religious tolerance)
 - ✓ Integrate a thematically corresponding global-ethic curriculum, lesson plans and value-clarification exercises

AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

Two CTC Teaching Artists will co-direct and produce an age-appropriate global-ethic musical for (3) three age-groups- during after-school hours (and if needed, weekend hours at CTC's Greenwich Village or West Village theater venues).

An *in-school faculty member* will accompany designated rehearsals to ensure consistent level of attendance, engagement, learning, and as needed, production status.

- ✓ Three (3) fully-staged 45-minute / One Act Musicals (per age group) based on a United Nations themes (ie human rights, environment, race amity, literacy, advancement of women, religious tolerance)
- ✓ Integrate a thematically corresponding gldobal-ethic curriculum, lesson plans and valueclarification exercises
- ✓ A robust global-ethic curriculum, lesson plans, games and exercises.

2 CULMINATING EVENTS:

- ✓ In-School performances
- ✓ UN performances at the General Assembly & for NGOs (UNICEF & Women's Summit)
- ✓ Multiple performance run at a professional theater venue in Greenwich Village

COMMUNITY-BUILDING & OUTREACH OPPROTUNITIES:

As a community-building device, CTC can reach out to the nearby community of children and youth, and host auditions – allowing neighborhood children an opportunity to earn ensemble roles, chorus roles or unfilled roles, as needed.





OUR CATALOGUE

Global Ethic & Value-Based Musicals for (4) Age Groups:

Group 4: 15-17 years old

Henry Box Brown: A blues & R&B musical set in the 1850's – where a Virginia Slave is aided by white and black abolitionists to ship himself to freedom in a dry good's box.

Rescue Me: A Musical History of Women: Tracks the advancement of women through the iconic songs and lyrics of the Top 40 songs of the last 100 years.

Nickel & Dimed: Rock & Folk musical based on *Barbara Ehrenreich's novel about a three month experiment surviving on minimum wage as a waitress, hotel maid, cleaning lady, and nursing aid.*

Group 3: 11-14 years old

King Kunka Bunka & the Rotten Royal Rascals: Princesses Proudeska, Jealousina, Chatterina and their royal brothers, Rudekov, Slackoff and Coughkov- are banished to working jobs to discover the secret to true happiness...

Wayward Knight: The King's loyal Knight sets out to serve his King but is distracted by robbers, monks and more...

Providence: The Story of Roger Williams: Accused of treason and sentenced to hanging for defending Native Americans, this court-room drama is the true story of Roger Williams – told through the eyes of his daughter.

Stone Soup: A group of musical gypsies travel from town to town with their songs and stories...but shut out by each village, until they serve up soup from stones...

Group 2: 8-10 years old

Butter Battle Wars: A Dr. Seuss inspired musical about two ethnic groups (yooks vs. zooks) divided by a wall of intolerance over which way to butter their toast.

The Lorax: A Dr. Seuss inspired rock and roll musical where an over-zealous entreprenuer chops down trees and builds more and more factories to chop down more trees to make thneeds, which everyone needs. The dark side of free-enterprise gone sour.

Horton the Elephant: A Dr. Seuss inspired flamenco style musical about Mayzie who swindles the faithful elephant to take care of the egg in her nest while she romps around Miami Beach. A musical court-room drama puts Horton on trial....to find out who the real parent is.

Farmer Rabbit's Fiesta: Farmer Rabbit learns that sharing is more fun than feasting alone.

Group 1: 5-7 years old

Yertle & Myrtle the Tyrant Turtles: Yertle & Myrtle demand that all the other turtles pile up higher and higher- so that they can see higher and higher....until Mac, at the bottom of the stack...burps.

Sneetches: Stars on your belly or off your belly is the latest craze...and the brother's McBean laugh all the way to the bank.

Miss Spider's Tea Party: Beetles, bugs and bumble bees gossip about Ms. Spider's tea party and web- until a tiny wet moth tells the truth of her generosity.

The Ugly Duckling: High School bullies and mis-fits see their reflection in the Hans Christian classic, the Ugly Duckling.

As a recording artist- Eric has teamed up singer/songwriter and producer JBEckl (Santana, WAR, Ozomatli) with whom he has toured across the US and Canada. Eric has a PHD from Duke University, in African American Music History.



KARIDA GRIFFITH - Resident Choreographer

Karida is a principal dancer with *Cirque Du Soleil* on Broadway and a member of the legendary *Radio City Rockettes*, and most recently the critically acclaimed MacArthur awarded, *Dorrance Dance Company* garnering a Bessie Award for "blasting open our notions of tap." Karida has performed at the Kennedy Center, as well as on Broadway in *an Ode to Frank Sinatra* at the Radio City Music Hall. She has also performed in the critically acclaimed *The Beat*, which was featured at the Harare International Festival of Arts in Zimbabwe.

KRISTINA GOLMOHAMMADI - Education Director and Associate Director

Kristina is a Senior Teaching Artist Trainer for the Center for Arts Education in New York City. She also leads workshops for the 21st Century Learning program, the English language and literacy learning through the Arts program and Arts Engage Initiative which integrates theater with Social Studies Curriculum. She is also a Co-facilitator at the New York Department of Education. Kristina is also a member of the largest theatre company in Sweden, the National Touring Company of Sweden and the International Theatre Company of Bratislava. She combined her 30 years of acting directing experience with her acting and directing career, Pedagogy and Educational with a BA from the University of Stockholm where she specialized in theatre as instruments for ethical development.



JILL BOLSTRIDGE - Co-Artistic Director

Jill is currently the Middle School Drama Teacher and Director at Poly Prep Country Day School in Dyker Heights, Brooklyn. She holds a MA in Theatre from Long Island University, C.W. Post and a BA in Theatre & English Literature from Roger Williams University in Bristol, Rhode Island. Jill has served as the co-Artistic Director of *The Children's Theatre Company* in Manhattan since 2004, where she has directed more than 30 productions featuring children and youth ages 4-19. She has also written and/or co-adapted several CTC plays and musicals. Jill has launched and taught at the CTC chapters in Boston, Los Angeles, Peekskill, New York, and Valley Stream, Long Island. Prior to her work at CTC, Jill was an instructor and director at The Drama Training Institute in Newton, Massachusetts, and was head of the after- school drama program at the Reynold's Arts Magnet School in Bristol, Rhode Island.



LORY LAZAURUS - Resident Composer

Lory has been a resident-composer for CTC for over 9 yrs, and is author of almost 350 songs. Lory writes about peace and unity, including his musical, *Attack of the Elvis Impersonators*, about the spirit of Elvis returning to Earth to unite mankind. Lory has written the CTC mini-musicals, including interpretations of Yertle the Turtle and The Lorax, and is the writer of the hit song "One World," which has been receiving radio airplay. He wrote 23 songs for *Barney & Friends* on PBS, and the theme songs for *The Healthy Kids Show* (Family Channel;) and *Hot Properties* (Life Time Network). He also was a staff writer for the Cartoon Network's *Courage, the Cowardly Dog*.
